

## SPF SIG Approved National Outcome Measures (NOMs)

**Indicator:** Past 30-day alcohol use among sixth through twelfth graders

**NOM:** Percent of 6<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup> grade students who have had an alcohol-related school suspension or expulsion, as measured by the total number of students receiving at least one alcohol-related suspension or expulsion during the school year divided by the total number of 6<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup> grade students enrolled in the school.

**Indicator:** Binge drinking among ninth through twelfth graders

**NOM:** The number of drug/alcohol-related arrests [for DUI, Drug Abuse Violations, and Liquor Law Violations (UCR-FBI defined)] divided by the number of total arrests and multiplied by 100.

**Indicator:** Binge drinking among 18 to 25 year old

**NOM:** The number of alcohol-related traffic fatalities (NHTSA/FARS defined) divided by the total number of traffic fatalities and multiplied by 100.

Alcohol-related traffic fatalities are defined as all fatalities in crashes involving a driver or motorcycle rider (operator) with a Blood Alcohol Concentration (BAC) Of .08 grams per deciliter (g/dl) or higher.

Traffic fatalities are defined as a police-reported crash involving a motor vehicle in transport on a trafficway in which at least one person dies within 30 days of the crash.
